

What is the diagnosis with this trace?

1. Polymorphic ventricular tachycardia
2. Atrial fibrillation with aberrant conduction
3. Monomorphic ventricular tachycardia and atrial fibrillation
4. Pre-excited atrial fibrillation (left lateral accessory pathway)
